Digital Innovation Hubs, digitising industry and catalysing innovation-led growth.

Digitalisation has fundamentally changed the way the society interacts with technology. We are on the edge of a digital revolution, which requires a holistic, integrated response involving stakeholders from the public and private sectors, academia and civil society. If Europe is to compete globally, it needs to consolidate national and regional initiatives to boost investment and stimulate technology uptake via strategic investments, partnerships and networks.

Building on previous debate under the European Commission's **Digitising European Industry (DEI)** initiative and the embedded **Digital Innovation Hub (DIH)** concept, ERRIN will present several regional case studies to illustrate applied methodologies in catalysing innovation-led growth, and how DIHs can support businesses, notably SMEs and non-tech industry, in their digital transformation. The event will bring together stakeholders with interests in establishing and managing DIHs, together with stakeholders and industry representatives.

Focusing on outcomes, the event will illustrate the European DIH landscape; identifying well-established hubs which demonstrate **successful financial and sustainability models**, **achievements and delivery mechanism** to create real regional economic impact. The discussion will draw out some of the requirements and potential challenges in **designing responsive support frameworks** to close the gap, and will support regions to develop their thinking around DIHs.

The event will include **perspectives from both regional actors and end-users**; ensuring a close link with ERRIN's policy work on Regional Innovation Ecosystems. The European Commission will give its view on the added value of DIHs, their links to the **Thematic Smart Specialisation Platforms (S3Ps)** and other strategies for digitalisation, including as well how DIHs connect to industrial partnership initiatives.
